
Demolition Application: NHC received a demolition application on July 16, 2015 for 10 Harlow Avenue, Norfolk owned by Robert and Sandra Paquette. This home was built 1938; the building is rotted; the cellar is a crawl space with a dirt floor where the heating unit is located; the plumbing is on the exterior of the home. The interior is filled with black mold. The home was previously owned by Art Marshall; it may have been built as a summer cottage. The new owners intend to build a new home on the property.

Discussion ensued, and it was determined that the home is not historically significant.
